REGULATION

ON THE COMPLETION AND ASSESSMENT OF MASTER'S DEGREE THESIS

IN YEREVAN STATE UNIVERSITY

(Approved at YSU Academic Council Session № 5 on 2 March 2017)

MASTER'S DEGREE THESIS REQUIREMENTS

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1.1. Master's degree thesis is an individual research, analytical and/or applied in essence, complete work which reflects student's ability to use the gained knowledge and to carry out individual study within the framework of the given specialty, as well as skills in raising scientific issues and putting forward new solutions.
- **1.2.** Completion and public defence of master's degree thesis are among the graduation requirements of master's degree programme.
- **1.3.** Master's degree thesis is an individual and summarizing component of master's degree programme. In case of full-time education mode the completion and defence of master's degree thesis is carried out in the 2-4th semesters, and in case of part-time education mode in the 3-5th semesters. All students are obliged to have preassigned topics and academic supervisors of master's degree thesis by the end of the 1st (in case of part-time education mode the 2nd) semester. A workload of 27 ECTS

credits is provided for the completion and defence of the master's degree thesis.

2. SAMPLE STRUCTURE OF MASTER'S DEGREE THESIS

2.1. The sample structure of master's degree thesis is presented in Table 1.

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ARRANGEMENT OF MASTER'S DEGREE THESIS

- 3.1. Master's degree thesis is submitted for the defence in computer-typeset form printed (bound) and in electronic versions. Paper size A4 (210 mm x 297 mm), margins: from the left 3.0 cm, from the right 1.5 cm, from above 2.0 cm and from the bottom 2.5 cm. The material is typed only on one side of the paper. The text is typed in "Unicode" coding system font. The headings and text are assembled in 12 pt font size, with line spacing of 1.5. The headings of chapters are written in bold and capital letters. Each chapter begins on a new page. The paragraphs are aligned from both sides with 1 cm first line indentation. All the pages of the thesis including the annexes are numerized in the bottom centre of the page. The numerization begins from the Contents which is considered the 4th page.
- **3.2.** The tables, pictures and charts, annexes, etc. which are present in the thesis, are numerized and titles are given to them (in case

of necessity references are given as well). The titles of pictures, charts, blueprints, definitions of marks are written below them in the centre in 10 pt font size. The titles of tables are written above the them and the ones of annexes – in the right upper corner of a new page.

- **3.3.** Bibliography is presented at the end of the thesis in alphabetic order in the following succession of languages: Armenian, Russian, English. The literature presented in the bibliography is written in the original language. At first, the last name(s) of author(s) and the initial(s) of their first name(s) are mentioned, then the full name of the material (book or article, full or acceptable short name of journal), place of publication, publishing house/company, year of publication, the numbers of volume and issueance, serial number, pages or the number of pages of the book. In case of materials published on the Internet the same principles are applied by mentioning the URL address of the corresponding material and the date of being introduced to it at the end (e.g. ... // URL: http://www.info..., 14.06.2016)
- **3.4.** References in the text are given in square brackets in accordance with the sequencial number of the literature presented in bibliography ([1], [2-5], [3, 7, 9-11], [3, p. 15], [7, p. 5-9]) or by mentioning the last name of the author and year of publication (Poghosyan, 2015; Petrosyan and others, 2010) or in the footnote, as in the example¹.
- **3.5.** The minimum and maximum volumes of the account of master's degree thesis are defined by the academic coucils of faculties

(centres, insititutes) proceeding from the peculiarities of the specialty.

4. COMPLETION AND DEFENCE OF MASTER'S DEGREE THESIS

- **4.1.** The completion and defense of master's degree thesis is carried out in compliance with the timetable of study process arrangement defined for the YSU full-time education system (see Table 2). In part-time education mode each activity is realised a semester later than the deadline mentioned in Table 2.
- **4.2.** Master's degree thesis preparation activities are carried through consultancy with and monitoring of the academic supervisor. The academic supervisor's responsibilities are as follows:
 - a) preparation of the master's degree thesis assignment,
 - b) preparation of the thesis work plan (timetable) and monitoring of its realisation,
 - c) provision of recommendations or consultancy on the selection and use of topic-related literature and other sources,
 - d) aid to student in research plan development,
 - e) consultancy with student on all the issues concerning the completion of master's degree thesis in accordance with the consultations semester schedule defined by the academic subdivision,
 - f) apprising student with the provisions, requirements and assessment standards and criteria of the present regulation,
 - g) consultancy with (aid to) student on speech preparation and selection of the presentation materials relating to the defence,

- h) preparation of the academic supervisor's written overview about the thesis.
- **4.3.** The following points are reflected in academic supervisor's overview:
 - a) the topicality and significance of the thesis,
 - b) student's ability of working individually, data handling and formulating grounded conclusions,
 - c) presence of elements having scientific, methodological and/or practical innovation in the thesis,
 - d) presence of practical recommendations/guaranties,
 - e) advantages and faults in the completed work,
 - f) the compliance of the thesis arrangement with the requirements of the present regulation,
 - g) guaranty for the public defence of the thesis.
- **4.4.** The pre-defence of master's degree thesis is carried out in the specialisation academic subdivision (inter-chair commitee) with the participation of the heads of the subdivision and master's degree study programme as well as the academic supervisor of the student.
- **4.5.** During the course of thesis pre-defence upon the detection of plagiarism (any thesis material (text) brought in considerable amounts from other sources without a reference is considered plagiarism) the thesis is not allowed for the public defence.
- **4.6.** During the course of public defence upon the detection of plagiarism the thesis is assessed as "unsatisfactory".

4.7. The public defence of master's degree thesis is carried out in compliance with the Regulation established by the RA Ministry of Education and Science².

5. MASTER'S DEGREE THESIS ASSESSMENT

- **5.1.** The assessment of master's degree thesis is carried out on 20-point scale according to the defined standards and their corresponding criteria (see Table 3).
- **5.2.** Student's resultant grade is the avarege of the resultant grades given by the members of the final attesting committee.
- **5.3.** Only the members of final attesting committee who were present during the whole course of a given student's defense assess the student's master's degree thesis.
- **5.4.** The assessment results of the final attesting committee are made public in the presence of students straightly after summarisation.

6. APPEAL OF THE ASSESSMENT RESULTS

- **6.1.** After the public disclosure of the assessment results the head of the committee asks the present students whether or not they have complaints.
- **6.2.** Straightly after the public disclosure of the assessment results in case of having a complaint student submits an application to the head of the committee.
- **6.3.** Appeal is realised if violations of the procedural provisions of the abovementioned regulation on the "Final Attestation of Graduates of the RA Institutions Realising Higher Professional Study Programmes" (hereinafter Regulation) are present.
- **6.4.** Straightly after receiving the application the head of the committee presents the committee members' assessment results according to the standards and criteria mentioned in paragraph 5.1 of the present regulation to the graduate.
- **6.5.** In case of detection of errors in the implementation of procedures in the assessment process and calculation and summarization of the assessment grades the committee:
 - a) changes the student's grade if the violation or error detected has affected the result of the assessment,
 - b) does not change the grade if the violation or error detected has not affected the result of the assessment,
 - c) annuls the results of the defense if there are severe procedural violations of the Regulation and immediately arranges a new defense.
